He has attended numerous site health and safety inductions, he carries out tool box talks for all site based employees on a regular basis. Site foremen are responsible for all aspects of supervision on site. These foremen have been selected because of their experience on construction sites and their ability to manage their team of workers to ensure a quality end product that is constructed in a safe manner. All foremen and hold a gold supervisor CSCS card, are trained first aiders and have NVQ's in underpinning and piling operations.

We have had no formal notice or legal proceedings by the HSE since the start of business in 1990

Details of any accidents/incidents/diseases reported in the last three years:

12th December 2013 One none reportable incident involving a person working on site.

- The accident took place at a domestic property in Sutton, Surrey.
- This person sustained soft tissue bruising and swelling to index finger
- Finger was trapped in access door to hired in plant
- The person required attended hospital as an out patient
- The accident was not caused by any hazards resulting from Morcon Foundations Limited works being unsafe, however we have informed hire company of the incident with a view to better signage on hired machinery..

1 October 2012 One reportable accident involving a person working on site.

- The accident took place at Cleckheaton in West Yorkshire.
- This person sustained strained muscles to his left ankle due to slipping on mud



- The person required hospital treatment as an out patient
- The accident was notified to the HSE by Morcon Foundations
- The accident was not caused by any hazards resulting from Morcon Foundations Limited works being unsafe, however we are now putting greater emphasis on awareness on slips and trips along with housekeeping.
